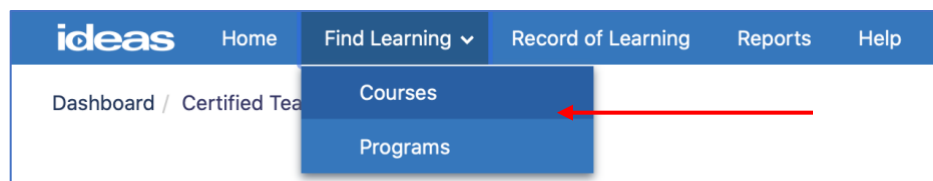

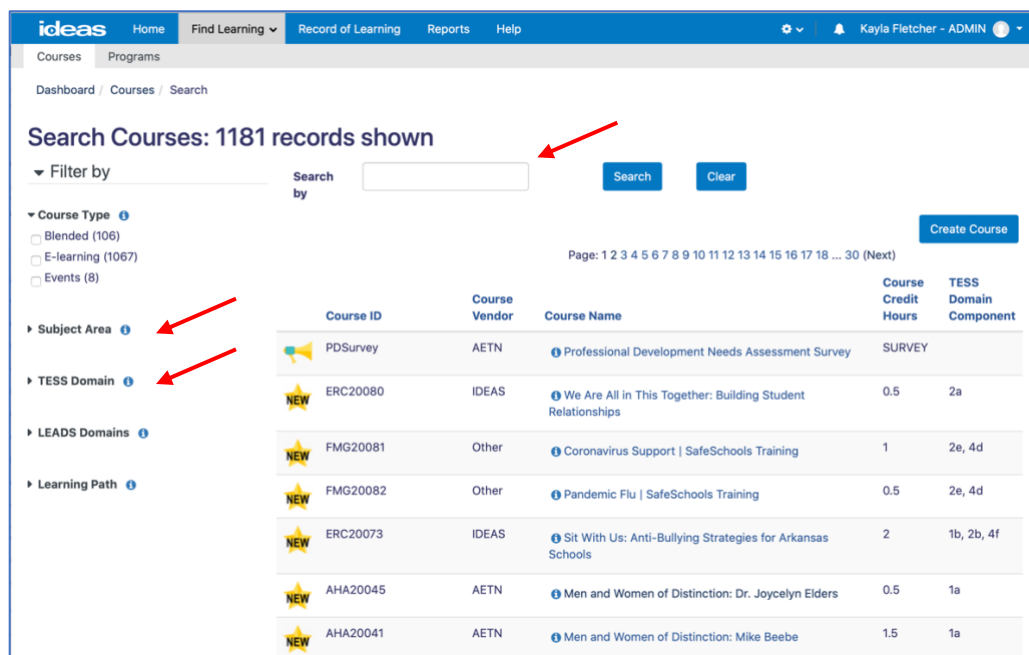
After you have verified your email, you will automatically be directed back to the main home page.

This series was developed to help Arkansas educators meet the requirements in the Right to Read Act (Act 1063 of 2017).

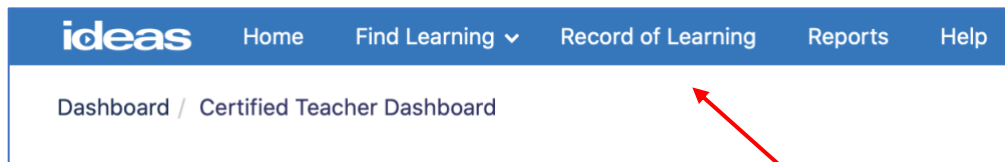

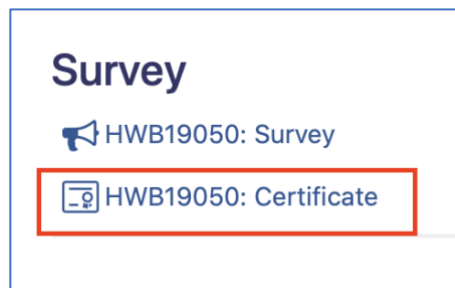
